- Holi-Do: Use energy-efficient LED lights.
- Holi-Do: Properly secure inflatable lawn ornaments.
- Holi-Do: Replace frayed light strands.
- Holi-Do: Use indoor lights inside.
- Holi-Do: Keep space heaters at least 3 feet from bedding, clothing, draperies, furniture and rugs.
- Holi-Do: Keep candles on solid surfaces and away from flammable items.

- Holi-Don't: Overload power strips.
- Holi-Don't: Leave decorations on all night.
- Holi-Don't: Allow fingers or paws near electrical decorations.
- Holi-Don't: Use tinsel it's not environmentally friendly and can't be recycled.
- Holi-Don't: Use space heaters near water or flammable liquids.
- Holi-Don't: Fall asleep with an electrical blanket left on.

Florida Cold Weather Energy Efficiency Tips

Check out these tips to warm up to savings during sweater weather:

- If you keep your thermostat at 68 degrees, you can save 4-6% on the heating portion of your bill for each degree you lower it below 68.
- Set the A/C fan to 'auto.'
- Replace or clean dirty A/C filters monthly.
- Install a programmable thermostat to adjust the temperature automatically.
- Keep drapes and blinds open during the day to let in the sun's heat.
- Set your ceiling fan to run clockwise to force warmer air toward the floor.
- Monitor electric and water consumption hourly with OUC's Usage Dashboard.
- Set alert notifications when a specified consumption threshold is met to help control energy costs.
